- 1. Distribute parts of the packet to the appropriate crew adviser (Action, Creative, Paparazzi) beforehand so they will be prepared for the planning meeting.
- 2. Hold a planning meeting with the advisers to determine activities.
- 3. With the other adult leaders, decide which local charity should benefit from the charity drive or let your A-Team students decide.
- 4. Decide the start date of the drive at the beginning of November to ensure it is finished by Superintendent Day..
- 5. Work with the Action Crew leader and students to plan for location drop-off within the school, as well as daily storage and a final collection.
